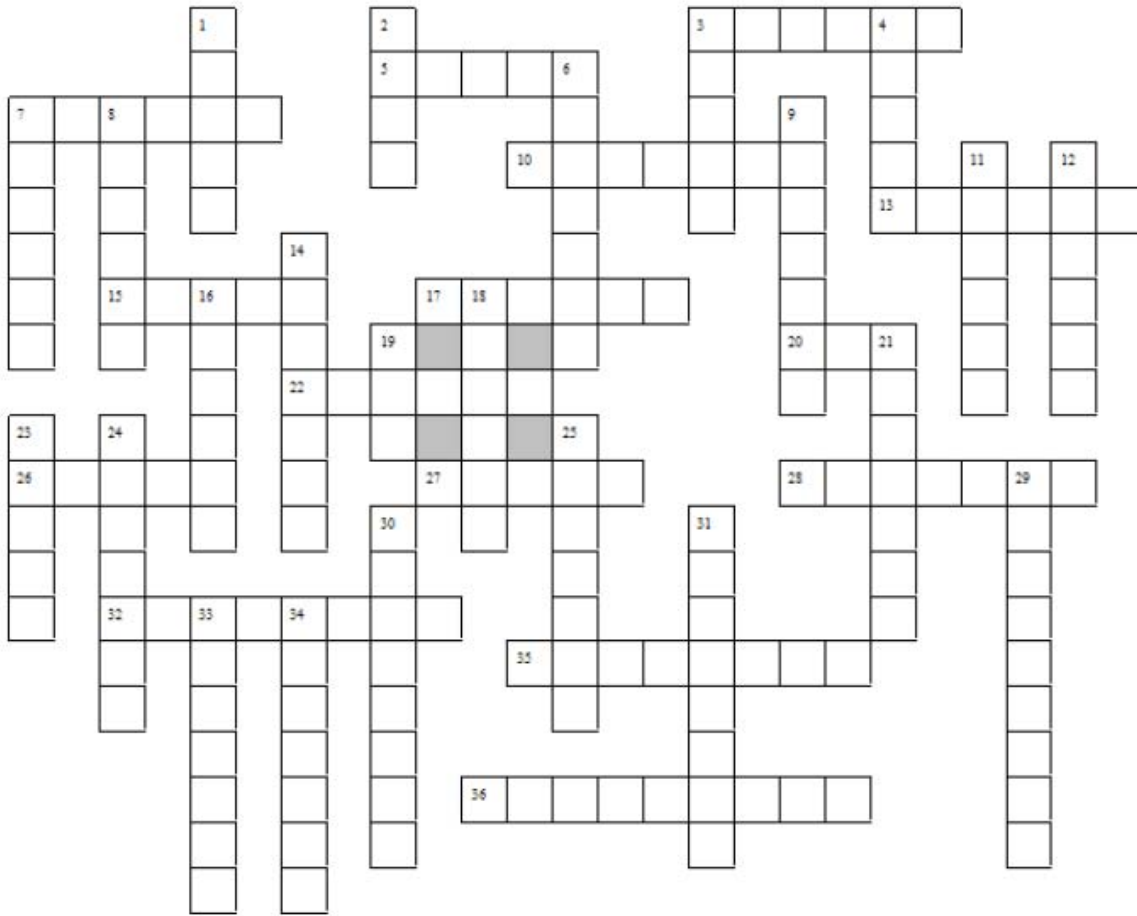


# Shabbat Crossword Puzzle

- 3 Jewish day begins.
- 5 Service immediately following morning service.
- 7 Fit to be eaten or used according to the dietary or ceremonial laws.
- 10 On this day, the L-rd rested.
- 13 Prayer shawl holding fringes containing 613 knots as reminders of the commandments.
- 15 Podium
- 17 A roll of parchment.
- 20 Cabinet where the Torah scrolls are kept.
- 22 During Aleinu, this is done.
- 26 Spiritual leader of a Jewish congregation; qualified to expound and apply Jewish law.
- 27 First five books of the Bible.

- 1 Shabbat is considered like this wife of a king.
- 2 Hebrew word for "verily."
- 3 Congregants do this at the beginning of Amidah.
- 4 The L-rd freed our ancestors from slavery in this land.
- 6 Shabbat commemorates this. Release from slavery.
- 7 Skullcap head covering worn by Jews during services.
- 8 A learned, pious Jew, who has undergone special training to create copies of the Torah.

- 11 Ascension. Immigrating to Israel. Reading from the Torah during services.
- 12 Prayer book.

**19** Number of candles lit before Sabbath representing the Fourth Commandment.

**21** Aramaic prayer recited between each section of the prayer book.

**23** Shabbat is considered like this newly married woman.

**24** Second part of Fourth Commandment; comply with, conform to.

**25** Weekly Torah portion.

**29** Morning service.

**30** Refrain from doing this type of work on Shabbat.

**31** Shabbat commemorates this. The act of causing the world to exist.

**33** Afternoon service.

**34** Prayer shawl is usually worn this time of day.
