1. **Yad Vashem - Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes Authority.**
2. **Yom Ha'Atzma'ut - Israeli Independence Day**
3. **Kaddish - Prayer for the departed.**
4. **Mt. Herzl - Official Yom Ha'Atzma'ut ceremony is held there on the eve of the holiday.**
5. **Israel Prize is an award presented by the State of Israel on Israeli Independence Day in Jerusalem.**
6. **Yom HaZikaron - Israeli fallen soldiers Remembrance Day**
7. **Yom HaShoah - Holocaust Remembrance Day**
8. **Knesset - Israeli Parliament**
9. **Barbecue - Many Israelis barbecue on Yom Ha'Atzma'ut.**
10. **Semi-mourning - The period of counting the Omer is a semi-mourning period where haircuts, shaving, listening to instrumental music, conducting weddings, parties or dinners with dancing are forbidden.**
11. **Forty-nine days are counted between the second day of Passover and Shavuot. This is known as Counting the Omer.**
12. **David Ben-Gurion declared the State of Israel on May 14, 1948**
13. **Tenth of Tevet - winter day where Holocaust victims are remembered.**
14. **Lag B'Omer is the 33rd day of the Omer period. On this day, the rules of mourning are lifted. Different groups observe different periods of mourning.**
15. **Six Million - Number of Jews killed in the Holocaust.**
16. **Tisha B'Av - summer day where Holocaust victims are remembered.**
