MIRIAM'S FINAL LESSON

"The entire congregation of the children of Israel arrived at the desert of Zin in the first month, and the people settled in Kadesh. Miriam died there and was buried there." -Bamidbar 20:1

"Moses raised his hand and struck the rock with his staff twice, when an abundance of water gushed forth, and the congregation and their livestock drank." -Bamidbar 20:11

In the 1970's Dr. Elisabeth Kubler-Ross discovered and named the 5 stages of grief. The five stages are Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, and Acceptance. Her work revolutionized the way we walk through the losses in our lives. In her wisdom, Dr. Kubler-Ross noticed the human capacity to not only deny grief and resist grief, but also to become angry at it. It is our anger that prevents true healing through authentic emotional release. By identifying and claiming this process of grief, we can have compassion for our humanity and provide space for our emotions to flow and our hearts to heal.

This week in Torah, Miriam, in her final appearance, and her brother Moses teach us the same lesson. When Miriam passes away five things happen to her people. First, they enter into denial and focus on the lack of water in their life. Second, the people then become angry at their thirst. Then, third, they bargain and complain to Moses and speak of the past with rose -colored glasses and forget the journey they have been on. Moses, using the imagery of the rock, is a perfect metaphor for a closed mind and heart that occur in the fourth stage of depression, then bangs on the rock with his rod and water appears. The people then in stage five drink from the water and find acceptance. This flow of water allows the journey to continue and

#### his people to heal and find faith again.

Where can we take this final lesson from Miriam into our lives? Where are we resisting some emotional truth in our hearts? Where are we staying closed and angry at the changes we are encountering? Is it time for us to let our tears flow and heal?

Those of us who have experienced great loss can understand the fear of opening the door to sadness and pain. It may even feel like we will be overwhelmed. Miriam offers a different truth. The truth she offers is healing. Miriam, the feminine of us all, reminds us that life is our garden and that our tears are the seeds that will help it grow. For new flowers, plants, and connections to love to emerge, we must water them with our truth and not run from our pain. Miriam taught us so many things. She taught us to dance. She taught us to sing. She taught us to practice tolerance. She taught us to forgive. And...Finally, she taught us to heal.

"Always be like water. Float in the times of pain or dance like waves along the wind, which touches its surface." – Santosh Kalwar


