THE MONTH OF SHEVAT:

HOPE AND KINDNESS IN THE WINTER

"The highest form of wisdom is kindness." – Talmud, Brachot 17a

As the sky turns gray and the trees expose their bones for all of us to see, we find ourselves in the Hebrew month of Shevat. Shevat, the 11th month after Nisan and the middle winter month of our Jewish calendar sends us strong messages of hope and kindness for things to come.

The message of "hope" comes from what the holiday Tu'B Shevat is probably best known. Tu'B Shevat, the Birthday of the Trees, is celebrated on the 15th day of the month. We may ask the question, "Why do we celebrate the birthday of the trees during a time when they are most bare?" Celebrating the abundant nature of trees and all they bring to use in their ripest form, gives us a moment of hope in the middle of winter. This brilliant weaving of hope in the *Rhythms of Life* is a common thread that runs throughout the Jewish calendar.

The second strong message we can extract from the month of Shevat, is kindness. Kindness comes from the name "Shevat." The acronym for Shevat is said by some to represent the Hebrew phrase, "Shenishma Besurot Tovot" which translates to "be blessed to share good things."

As we walk through Winter, separated from others by nature more than other times of the year, we are reminded of the gift of Acts of Kindness.

With my message for the beginning of 2022, I offer you the following challenge: Reach out, like the

branches of a tree, and drop your "fruit" on the plates of those around you. Use your kind words and actions to bring light, joy, hope, and abundance to those who find winter a troubling time. As you step outside of yourself and proceed in the direction of others, you will sense a shift away from your self-centered fear as you connect with the wholeness of humanity.

Wisdom is attained through kindness. Kindness is a builder of hope.
